

Master of Athletic Training (MAT) Program - Prerequisite Evaluation Policy

Criteria for accepting coursework:

- Official evaluations are performed based on official transcripts and documentation received and verified by ATCAS.
- 2. U.S. Colleges/Universities must be regionally accredited by one of the official accrediting bodies in the U.S.
- 3. The student must complete a Bachelor's degree from a regionally-accredited U.S. College or University, and complete the following prerequisites:
 - a. Chemistry I with lab
 - b. Physics I with lab or Biomechanics
 - c. Two course series of human anatomy & physiology with lab
 - d. Biology
 - e. Psychology with an emphasis on individual behavior (general, abnormal, or developmental)
 - f. Introductory Statistics or Biostatistics
- 4. Completion of at least four of the seven prerequisites is recommended prior to submitting an application that includes a plan for completing the remaining prerequisites prior to enrollment.
- 5. At the time of application, prerequisite courses are evaluated on a course-by-course basis by a representative from the College of Health Professions Office of Admissions and Student Affairs. If it is not clear from the course title, as listed on the official transcript, that the prerequisite has been met, the student is asked to provide a course syllabus to both Admissions and the Program Director (PD). The PD reviews the course description, required textbooks, and weekly schedule to determine if the course meets the prerequisite requirement.
- 6. If students have not completed all of the prerequisites at the time of application, they may be accepted on a conditional basis, pending the completion of remaining prerequisite courses. The student is required to submit proof of prerequisite completion prior to matriculation via official transcripts.
- 7. In order for a course to fulfill prerequisite requirements, the student must have earned at least a "C" in the course.
